And that argument structure implies a conclusion can ONLY be accepted as true if there is no single fact, or in this case no single piece of evidence that suggests an alternative explanation/conclusion to Bob Chappell's disappearance. That is because it is nonsense to accept one inferred conclusion as the only possible truth when there are indications of competing scenarios. Yet in this trial the significance of both forensic and witness evidence that inferred others' involvement was erroneously denied as significant, and hence dismissed without further investigation. This legal argument is both unsound and invalid within the classical rules of logic. I call on the Attorney General to logically explain how this is not a fallacious argument, and hence to restore respect in the judiciary as a reasonable institution.</p>
